



Define by uncovering the issues through gathering insights and genuine experiences from/by young people.

Create

Generate ideas and co-produce solutions with/by young people.

Reflect

Consider the future impact and sustainability of the ideas produced.

Recomended

Produce influential ideas/solutions with young people.

Implement

Implementation of ideas/solutions with young people.

What is Future Routes?

As part of the Year of Young People 2018 @, Scottish Natural Heritage, Young Scot and ReRoute have created a new fund for young people called Future Routes. Young People's Responses



1. Promote more careers for young people working in the environment 2. Easier access to information - share opportunities on social media 3. Education in how to recognise 'fake news' 4. Create more links between Young People / MSYPs and Politicians 5. More events for young people to get involved with $6 \cdot$ Lower the voting age to give young people the right to have a say 7. More positive role models (not just celebrities on social media) 8. Easier and more links between young people worldwide 9. A focus on similarities and differences - looking at the positives 10. Advertisements - Online, TV, Radio, Phone 11. More work within schools 12. Improve communications from National Government and Local Authorities

13. Develop an App which relays all info on local opportunities 14. Help change perceptions of young people 15. One universal (non-verbal) language of agreement
