It is my pleasure to host this celebration of Scotland's "United Nations University Recognised Regional Centre of Expertise on Education for Sustainable Development". As will be obvious, a title like this benefits from abbreviation, and as I am sure most of you know, in alignment with Scotlish Government Policy, it is commonly known as "Learning for Sustainability Scotland".

The University has a strong and longstanding commitment to sustainability through its degree programmes, its research, outreach activities such as MOOCs and its governance and estate policies; and my predecessor Sir Tim O'Shea was here in the Playfair Library to launch the Centre just over 10 years ago.
