You'll be asked **five** questions:

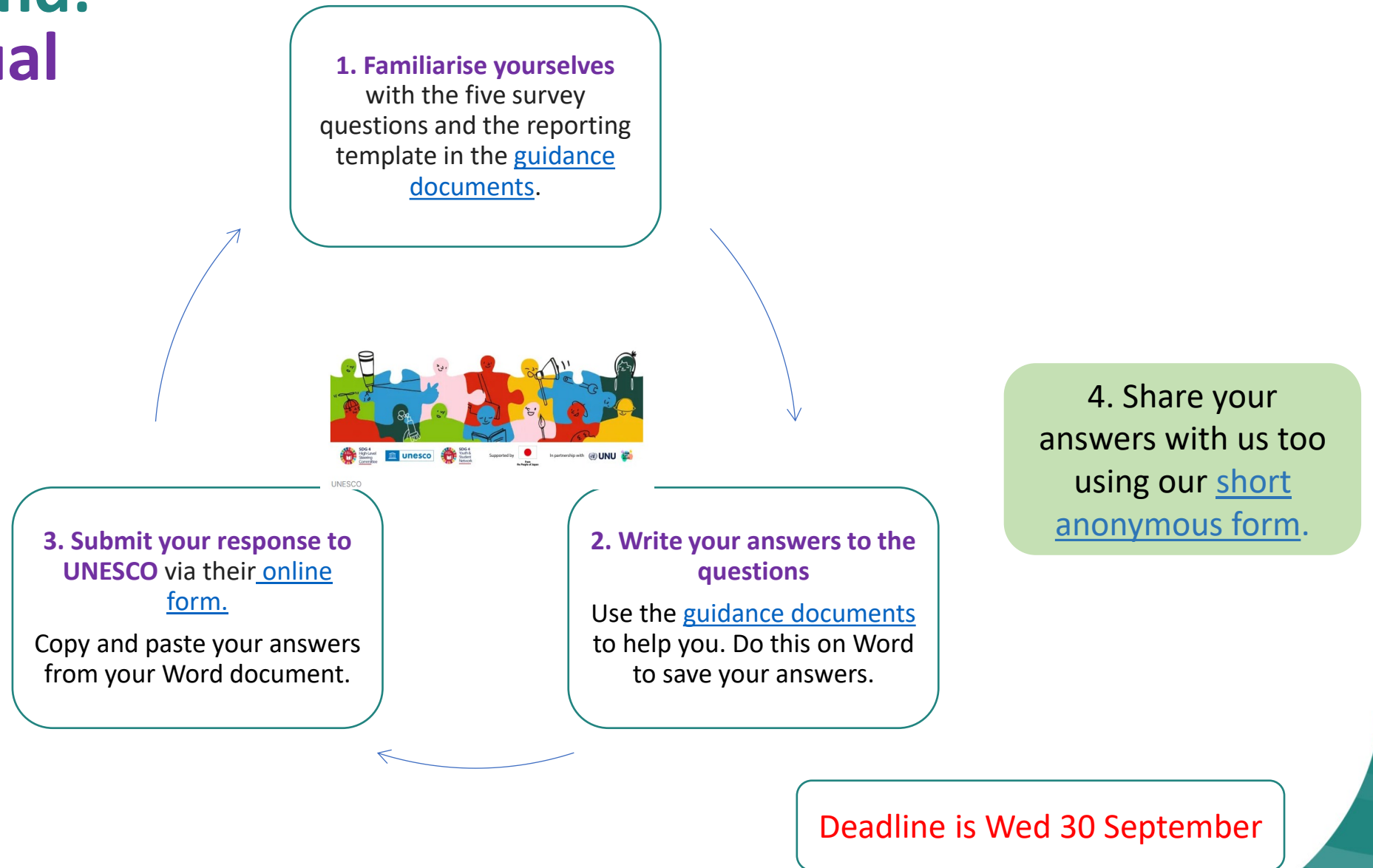
3. And **what should be kept or strengthened from the current education and learning system** because you believe it's important and working well?

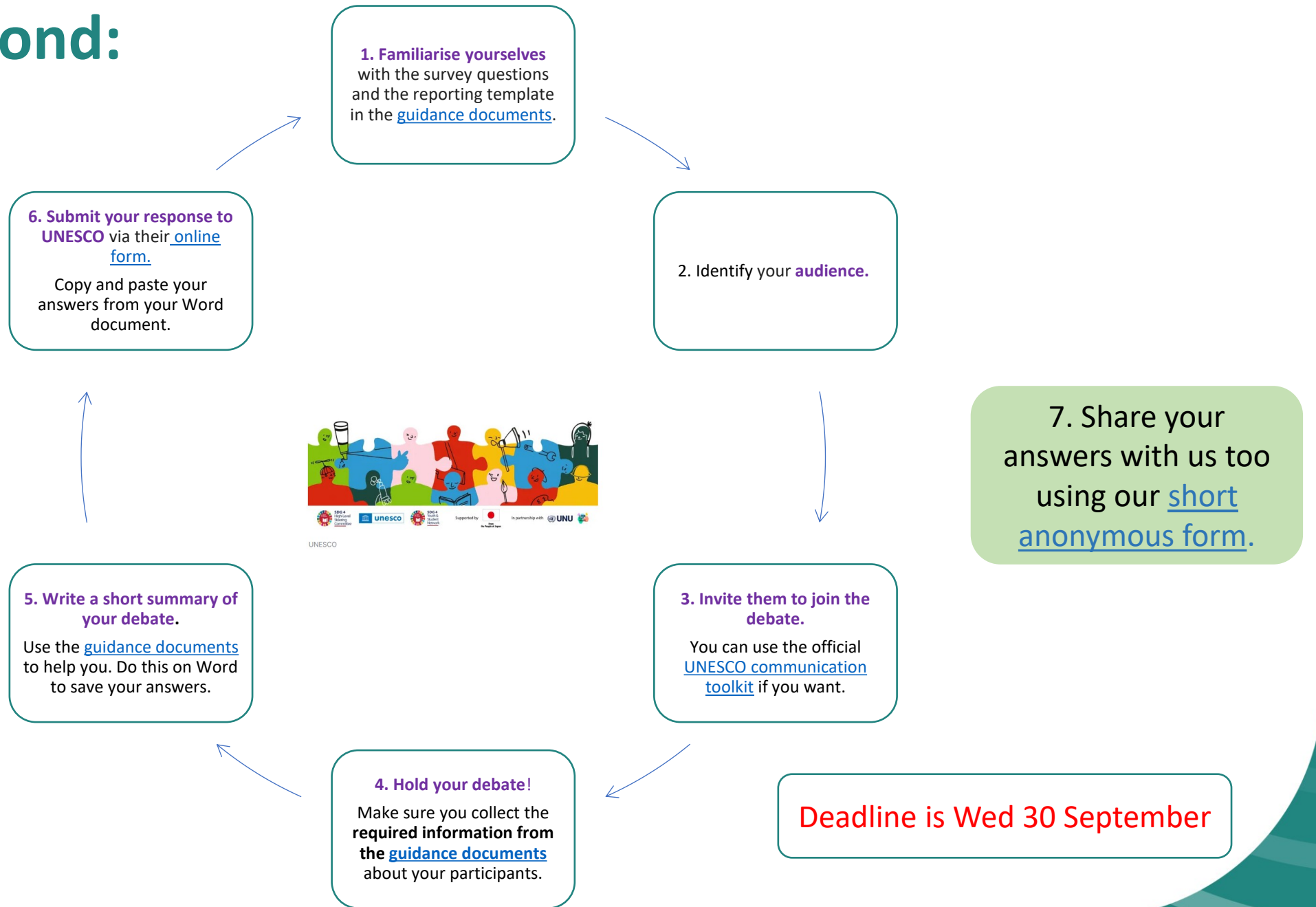


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How to respond: as an individual

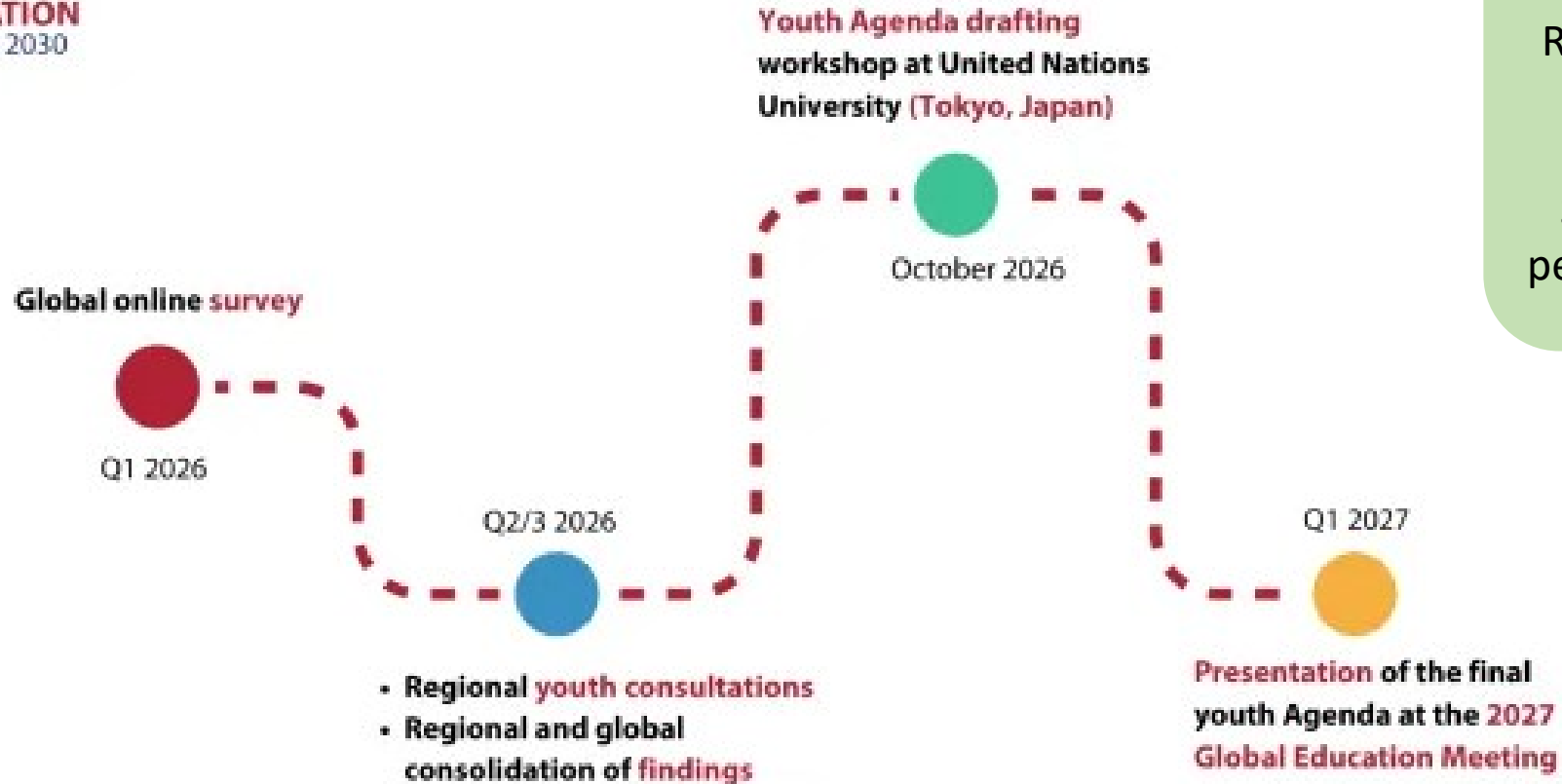
